### Expensive Shredded Art (Page 6)

About three years ago, a painting called *Girl with the Balloon* – by the anonymous English graffiti artist who goes by the name Banksy – went up for auction at Sotheby's in London. As soon as it sold for about €1 million to a collector from Europe, surprised 'oohs' and 'aahs' could be heard from onlookers. The painting was shredding itself!

The process did not fully complete, however, and strips of the painting hung down, still attached, at the bottom. Banksy later said the shredder had malfunctioned. No stunt like this had ever happened before in the art world.

The auction house said it knew nothing about the shredding plan, but many believe that is not the case. The sale of that painting was saved for the end of the auction, and it was displayed in a different way from the other paintings. The workers who affixed it to the wall surely would have noticed extra weight from the embedded shredder.

Since then, the painting was displayed in Germany and is now on a world tour. The partially shredded painting, now aptly retitled *Love in a Bin*, is up for sale yet again. Sotheby's expects it could bring in a price six times higher this time around!

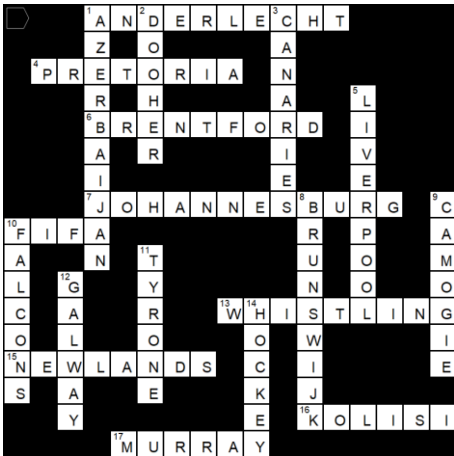

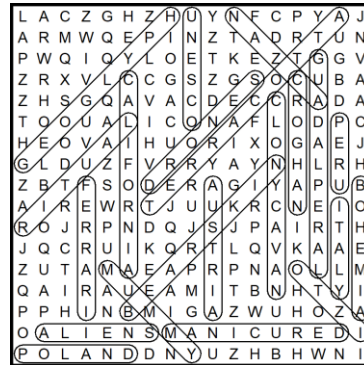
